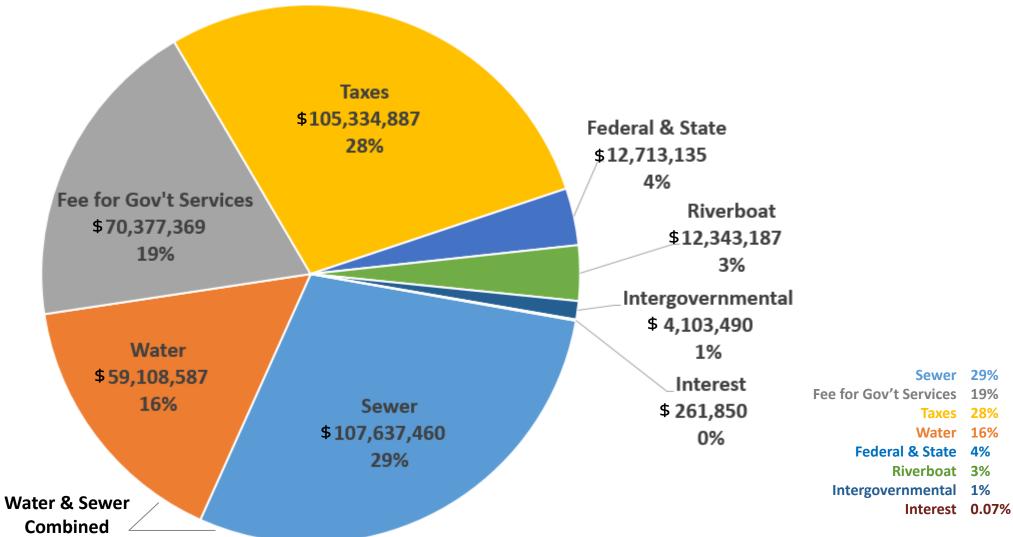

2018 Proposed Budget **REVENUES**

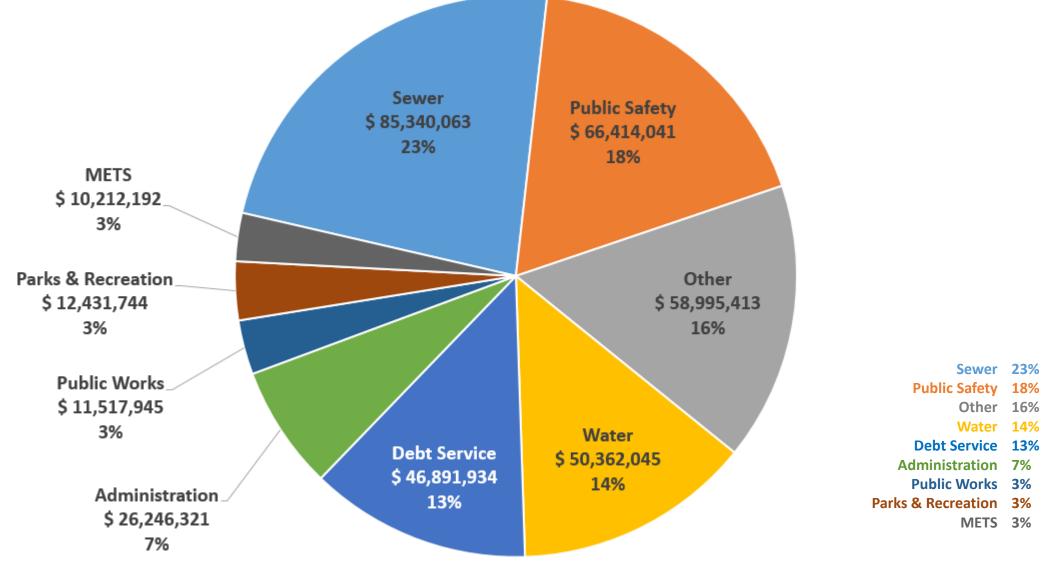

2018 Proposed Budget **EXPENDITURES**

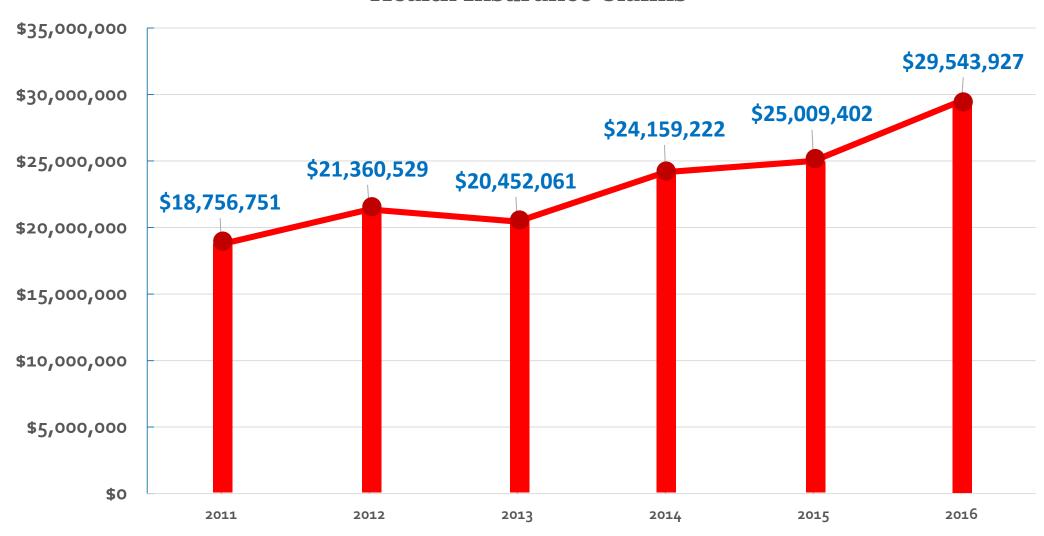

Status of Health Coverage



Actions taken in 2017 to reduce cost include:

Changes to Plan design.

1

Prescription drug RFP resulted in change in Rx vendors, which provided discounted pricing below current costs and increased manufacturers' prescription drug rebates to the City.

3

Implemented prescription drug clinical programs that ensures appropriateness of drugs at a lower cost.

4

Initiated international prescription drug program that provides prescription drugs at discounted rates that are lower than traditional pharmacy distribution channels.

5

Negotiated a rate hold on City's reinsurance and fixed cost.

Status of Health Coverage con't



Actions taken in 2017 to reduce cost include:

Changed dental coverage administration to local company, which has lowered dental claims cost.

Currently:

Conducting a medical plan RFP (evaluating self-funded and fully insured options) for an effective date of Jan 1, 2018, to further efforts of cost reduction while providing high-quality medical, dental and vision benefits for City associates.

Currently:

Evaluating clinic operations to identify cost reduction opportunities.
