The driver took a brown color blunt, with green looking substance inside of it, and gave it to the officers.</p> <p>The male suspect during my search of the vehicle, advised to the other officers that there was some weed on the driver's passenger side floor, and it was his.</p> <p>During our vehicle search I was able to find a green leafy substance on the driver's side passenger floor, where the male suspect was sitting at. I also found underneath the driver's seat, a small clear Jar with Jolly Junxtez Cake Batter written on it, that had small pieces of green leafy substance in it. I found a green leafy substance in between the shift lever and plastic cover of the center console.</p> <p>The male and female suspects were cited and released on scene.
