victim, after he had received additional information.

The reporting party stated he had not seen his daughter for approximately 1 month. He reported his daughter had not attended school / virtual learning in the last 28 days, according to his daughter's grandmother, identified as an involved other. His daughter frequently stayed with her grandmother and attended school while at her residence.

Additionally, the reporting party received information from his niece about his daughter's inappropriate behavior on social media.

Given the totality of the circumstances, the reporting party was obviously concerned his young daughter was with her drug addicted mother, somewhere on the streets, engaged in inappropriate behavior and had not attended school in almost a month.

When asked about their whereabouts, the reporting party did not have a clue where his wife or daughter were. However, he stated his wife had friends at the Evansville Inn & Suites, located at 2530 Old Business 41.

Officers went to the Evansville Inn & Suites, spoke with an employee and learned they were familiar with the involved subjects. The employee believed the victim moved between rooms #113 and #211. She reported room #211 was another employee, identified as an involved other.

Officers went to room #211 and attempted to make contact, but it took some time for someone to answer the door. Eventually, a female, the employee / involved other, answered the door and confirmed the victim was inside of the room.

Officers spoke with the victim and the involved other about the circumstances above. They reported the victim had been staying at the room for approximately 2 weeks and it had been approximately 1 week since the victim's mother, the offender, had been seen or heard from. The victim reported her mother was staying somewhere on the west side of Evansville, but did not know where. Both the victim and the involved other reported the offender had ignored messages and calls on social media for assistance with the victim. The victim had reportedly been ill, but could not be seen by medical professionals because they could not make contact with the offender in order to get documents signed, allowing her to receive care.

It was only then, the offender reached out to them after another resident contacted her on social media telling her the police were involved.

Speaking with the victim, she did not feel comfortable returning home to be with her father, the reporting party. Officers called him and spoke with him reference the above information. He denied the accusations, believed his daughter had discipline issues and did not want to live with rules as the reasoning she did not want to return to his residence.

Officers were able to find a middle ground and the reporting party was amicable to his daughter staying with her grandmother since that is where she frequently stayed

Additionally, the victim admitted to smoking marijuana and acknowledged truancy with school.
