Prior to my arrival Dispatch advised there were previous incidents at this residence involving the above defendant Kevin Roach and Helga Newton.</p> <p>In addition Dispatch also advised there was a BOL put out yesterday (Saturday) for a Silver Ford Focus. The BOL stated the occupants are Kevin Roach and Helga Newton. The witness in this incident stated that Kevin threatened to kill Newton while in the car. The caller advised Kevin was armed with a multi colored Knife.</p> <p>Dispatch also advised Roach is a Violent Offender and has Schizophrenia and can be unpredictable.</p> <p>I arrived on Vanderburgh Avenue and spoke with the caller who witnessed the incident. Mr. Evans stated he was sitting in his house and could hear yelling and screaming coming from outside his house. He looked out the window and could see the male up in the face of the female on the deck of the house. He states he had her pushed all the way in the corner of the deck and she was trying to get away. He stated at one point it looked like she was trying to get back into the house but he forced her off the front porch. Mr. Evans had notified his wife of the events at this time and both watched as the wife called 911. They saw the male grab the female by the back of the head and slam it into the passenger side of the car. The were not positive what body part made contact with the car but it made a very loud thud which they could here inside the house. After this, the male grabbed the female and threw her into the driver seat of the vehicle. The male then entered the passenger side and both sat there for maybe a minute. The vehicle then left and headed South on Kentucky Avenue.</p> <p>I put out a BOL for the vehicle and also had dispatch ping Helga`s phone. There were several pings and they were heading towards the East side. The final ping was around Glenmoor Road and Mr. Roach was located walking down the street. In his possession was the cell phone of Helga and her Driver`s License. Mr. Roach was taken to Headquarters to be Interviewed by Detective Mike Evans.</p> <p>During this time Officers were still trying to locate Hilga and her vehicle. Officers were able to track down several family members and a couple of hours later she finally called her phone which was in our custody. During this phone call she admitted there was an argument yesterday and that was when all of this started. She did state there was an argument and he grabbed her jacket and forced her into the car.
