Employees directed officers to the other party involved in the fight. Officers briefly detained Chris F., but quickly determined he was a victim. Chris stated he and the offender had came to the Inflatable Fun Factory together with a female friend (Female 1). Chris stated he was sitting next to Female 1 when the offender saw them and got jealous. Chris stated the offender told him "let's go outside." Chris stated he refused and was struck at least two or three times in the face by the offender. Chris stated after being hit, he pushed the offender away, before bystanders stepped in and separated the two. Officers did not locate any bruising or redness on Chris' face. Chris refused medical care and did not want to press charges against the offender.

Female 1 who witnessed the incident, stated she and Chris were sitting down at a table inside the play arena, when her ex-boyfriend (the offender) walked in and saw the two sitting next to each other. Female 1 stated the offender asked Chris to go outside with him. Female 1 stated Chris refused and the offender just started swinging on him before being broke up by other patrons inside the play arena.

Another woman, (Female 2) also witnessed the incident. Female 2 stated she was sitting at a table next to Chris and Female 1, holding her baby, when she heard yelling coming from their table. Female 2 stated she saw the offender start punching Chris several times. Female 2 stated as the offender reared his fist back to punch Chris, the offender accidentally elbowed her infant child in the head. Female 2 told officers her baby cried shortly after being hit, but was not hurt.

The manager of Inflatable Fun Factory later came to the scene and was given a case number with instructions on how to obtain a copy of his report.

Officers arrived on scene and spoke to the victim, as she was outside of her home, the above address. She had a laceration to her left cheek and left ear. The victim stated she and the offender, her husband, were involved in a verbal altercation prior to officers` arrival. The victim relayed she left the home so the argument would dissipate, but once leaving the home the offender contacted her by phone asking that she come home. She reported the offender, at the time of the call, stated they could make dinner when she returned and talk about issues tomorrow morning once he was "sober." The victim stated the offender had drank approximately one half to one full fifth of whiskey today and was highly intoxicated.

The victim stated, at the time of the call, she had parked her vehicle a few blocks of the home. She stated she walked back to the residence. She reported that upon entering back into the home the offender quickly became agitated and demanded the keys to their shared vehicle. She stated she went to the bedroom to begin packing a bag, as she decided she would be leaving for the evening. She reported the offender came into the bedroom and pinned her to the bed. She stated she was able to get from underneath the offender and went to a back room. She reported the offender followed her into that back room and she found he had a paring knife in his hand. She then went into a nearby bathroom where the offender, again, followed her. It was at this time the offender cut the victim's left cheek and ear with the knife. The victim stated she told the offender to stop and let her out of the bathroom, but he was blocking her from leaving this room. The victim reported she felt she could not leave the bathroom due the offender still having the knife in his hand. The victim relayed she was able to finally push the offender to vacate the bathroom, stating she pushed passed the offender on the opposite side in which he held the knife.

Officers located the offender still inside the residence upon arrival. The offender refused to step outside to speak to officers. He spoke to officers through the door, but due to the door not being open and the offender's state of intoxication officers had difficulty communicating with the offender.

Officers assisted the victim with accessing her vehicle. She stated she has been residing with her son, who lives outside of Evansville, for the past two months due to the offender's ongoing issues with alcohol. She informed officers she would be going back to her son's residence tonight.

The victim's injuries were captured by officers' BodyWorn Camera. The victim refused AMR.

The victim was provided with a case number and informed on how to follow up with charges. She was also provided with domestic violence resources.
